

Howard Ennes, with his wife, Marion Dusoir Ennes, retired to Fort Bragg CA several years ago after living for many years in New York. During his retirement he edited the many essays on environmental topics that his late wife wrote for several newspapers, and compiled them into a book, *Nature's Way*; it includes nature sketches by both of them. As a young man in World War II, Ennes was a health educator and advisor for the troops in the Army even though his earlier education was not in this subject, but he was assigned and he made a good job of it. And so much so that after Army service, he rapidly rose to chief health educator for the U.S. Health and Human Services. Later on, as an executive with Equitable Life Assurance Company, he originated employer payment of health coverage for employees. Ennes was frequently involved in political and social questions and with such interests it was not surprising that he and his family lived on the activist upper West Side of Manhattan for many years.
